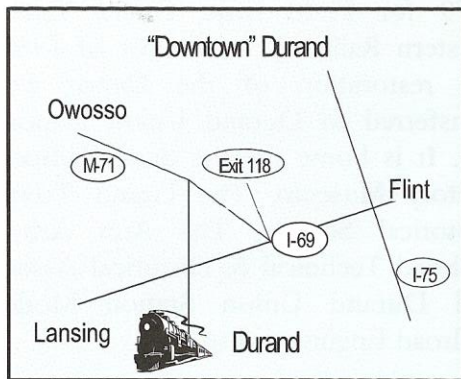


Directions

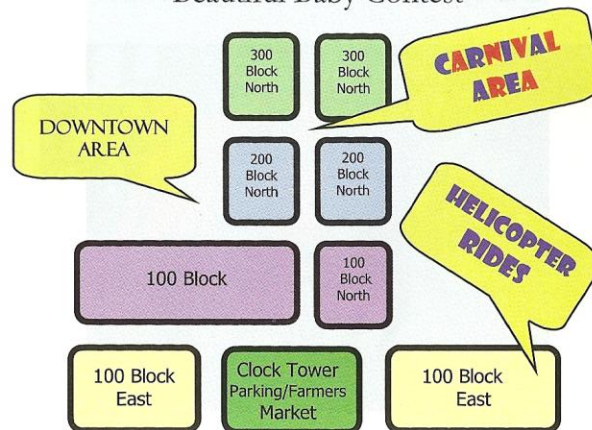

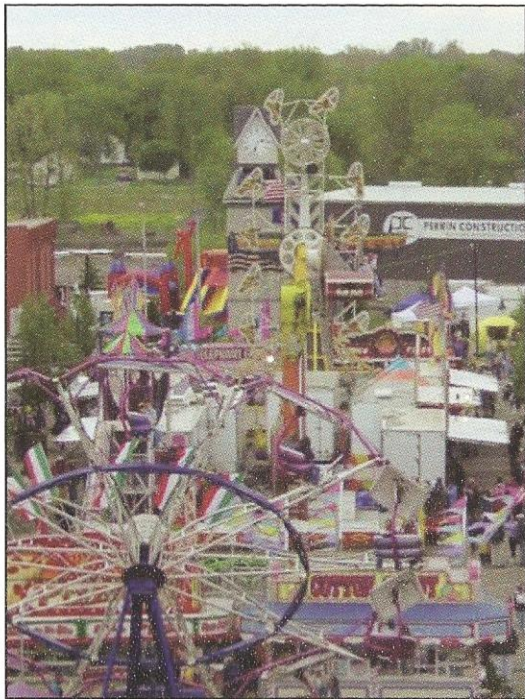

Durand Union Station known as "The Queen of the Rails"

Durand Union Station was built in 1903 and is said to be the most photographed depot in the United States. Bought by the City of Durand in 1979 for \$1.00 from Grand Trunk Western Railroad. In August of 1985, the restoration of the Depot was transferred to Durand Union Station, Inc. It is home for the State Railroad History Museum, The Grand Trunk Historical Society, The Ann Arbor Railroad Technical & Historical Assoc. and Durand Union Station Model Railroad Engineers display.
